Screening and Testing

Screening for COVID-19 symptoms should be initiated each morning prior to coming to school.

Students, staff, or visitors presenting any of the symptoms should remain at home.

Testing

- Voluntary On-site COVID-19 Testing may be conducted during the school day.
- The COVID-19 Testing performed on students is the **cheek swab**.
- Parental Consent is required in order for your student to be tested.
- ASA will notify the community if On-site COVID-19 Testing is scheduled.



Masks and Face Coverings

Unless exempt, all staff, students, and volunteers are required to wear masks or face coverings when sharing indoor spaces.

Exemptions:

- persons with a medical condition,
- mental health condition, or
- disability that prevents wearing a mask
- persons who are hearing impaired

Masks are not required outdoors.

Students may wear a mask from home or a school-issued mask.



Routine Hand-washing and cleaning

All staff and students will routinely wash or sanitize their hands, including:

- Before and after eating
- Before and after transitions
- Before or as they enter classrooms
- After using the restroom

Regular cleaning procedures shall be implemented, including

- High touch surfaces such as door handles, lunch tables, drinking fountains
- Daily cleaning of materials and tools such as computers



Contact Tracing

Contact Tracing is a public health practice that health departments use to identify and notify people who have been exposed to someone with an infectious disease.

The Director of Business Services, Health Technician, and CEO will coordinate contact tracing procedures for students or staff. All aspects of contact tracing are voluntary.



Isolation

While at school, a student presenting at least one symptom suspect of COVID-19 will be sent to a waiting area with staff until parent/guardian is contacted and picks up their student from school. The health office will contact parent/guardian to determine if the student has a documented health condition that more accurately accounts for the presenting symptom.



Quarantining Recommendations

Vaccinated	Unvaccinated (when both parties were wearing a mask during indoor exposure)	Unvaccinated (when either party was not wearing a mask during indoor exposure)
Refrain from quarantine and testing following a known exposure if asymptomatic	May continue to attend school if they: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Are asymptomatic• Continue to mask indoors• Undergo twice weekly testing during the 10 days from exposure• Quarantine for extracurricular activities	For those who remain asymptomatic, may discontinue quarantine under the following conditions: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• After day 10 from the date of last exposure without testing; OR• After day 7 if a test administered after Day 5 from date of last exposure is negative If symptoms develop, the exposed person should isolate, get tested, and contact their healthcare provider.
